





The Right to work without toxics: Phasing out Highly Hazardous Pesticides

The Special Rapporteur on the impact on human rights of hazardous substances and wastes is presenting at this 42nd session of the HRC a report on the **Principles on the protection of workers from exposure to toxic substances**. Agricultural workers are concerned just as well as industrial ones by the use of pesticides. Some these are known to be highly dangerous but remain in use, exposing the health and lifes of workers, their families and their environment. In this event we will look at:
