Linkages between CITES and wildlife diseases

- 1. International trade in wild animals and their products can spread wildlife diseases
- 2. The effects of wildlife diseases can influence CITES implementation decisions
- 3. Trade restrictions taken for sanitary reasons can impact programmes and projects designed to ensure the sustainable use of wildlife
- 4. People who depend on wildlife trade for their livelihood may be adversely affected



Role of CITES

- 1. CITES is a convention whose aim is to ensure that international trade in specimens of wild animals and plants does not threaten their survival
- 2. So far, CITES Parties have been reluctant to use the possibilities afforded by the Convention to control trade in wildlife for other purposes
- 3. WTO's Agreement on the Application of Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures (SPS Agreement) provides guiding principles
- 4. Other intergovernmental bodies have a primary role establishing guidelines, recommendations and standards for controlling diseases
