



**Diplomatic Briefing**  
**Requesting an Advisory Opinion on Climate Change to the International Court of Justice**  
**Thursday, 16 March 2023 - 2-3 PM CET**

On 20 February 2023, Vanuatu and 15 other States (Angola, Antigua and Barbuda, Bangladesh, Costa Rica, Federated States of Micronesia, Morocco, Mozambique, New Zealand, Portugal, Romania, Samoa, Sierra Leone, Singapore, Uganda, and Viet Nam) communicated to all UN member States the final version of the resolution seeking to request the International Court of Justice to issue an Advisory Opinion on States obligations with regard to climate change. The resolution, which is currently co-sponsored by 112 States, will be voted upon at the 77th session of the UN General Assembly, on 29 March 2023.

The resolution requests the ICJ to clarify States' obligations with regard to climate change, with specific attention to vulnerable States and affected peoples and individuals, including future generations. This resolution would provide the International Court of Justice with the mandate to address the obligations of States under international environmental law and human rights law with regards to climate change for the first time in its history. The Court will thus be in a position to provide important guidance for States with regard to the measures required by law for States to address the root causes of climate change and to deal with current impacts of climate change on the enjoyment of human rights.

The Permanent Mission of Vanuatu and the Center for International Environmental Law (CIEL) have the pleasure to convene this diplomatic briefing to discuss the resolution and its implications, and allow Geneva-based representatives of States, intergovernmental organizations and civil society organizations to exchange views on how to support this initiative.
